May they know your compassionate and loving care. Give understanding to those from whom they seek refuge. May we seek to understand their plight, the horror they have experienced and the bewilderment of our ways. Give us strength to dream of your Kingdom on Earth for all peoples.

14 Sat *Children – walking to school* January - cold and dark yet children skip along the road, run to the curb but know to wait for mums pushing younger brothers and sisters. Dressed in winter coats, hats and mittens their hearts warmed, their minds eager and keen and smiles as they meet friends. Lord make all the children remember the Christmas story and be warmed by the love of Christ, kind to friends and family and keen to know more of Jesus. Keep them safe on their journeys.
