MINISTER'S LETTER



Once again at this time of year we turn our thoughts to the birth of Jesus; but all too often the wonder of this awesome event is obscured by the trappings of Christmas – holidays, presents, food, television, etc. But it is worth having a much closer look at the wonder of God coming to earth as a baby. Think of any photos you may have around your house of babies; maybe your children, grandchildren or great grandchildren, or even babies your friends and families may have had?

When we consider the 'life' of a baby, what are the characteristics of babyhood? Total dependence for warmth, food and love; languageless; everything is 'new'; inability to move where you want to; nappies, teething etc. When we think about such things we start to marvel that the eternal Son of God would submit Himself to the state of babyhood.

Christian author Philip Yancey once said; "The God who roared, who could order armies and empires about like pawns on a chessboard, this God emerged in Palestine as a baby who could not speak or eat solid food or control his bladder, and depended on a teenage couple for shelter food and love."

- You, Jesus, were willing to lay aside everything your glory, your position, your power – for our sake.
- You were obedient to your Father in coming to earth.
- And in coming to earth as a helpless baby, not only were you trusting yourself to a young, inexperienced couple, but you were making yourself vulnerable to the attack of the devil through Herod. And yet you trusted your Father to keep you safe.

The Bible says; 'For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, the mighty God, the Everlasting Father, the Prince of Peace.' [Isaiah 9:6 KJV]

Given this wonderful description, readers of the Old Testament could be forgiven for expecting a glorious, triumphant entry into the world for the Messiah. But Jesus chose the way of obscurity, of humility and servanthood; yet those who seek Him, will find Him to be the glorious Messiah described in Isaiah chapter 9.

What a wonderful example to us today is the incarnation of God, setting forth the pattern that Jesus would grow up to present to us; a pattern for living, a pattern of gentleness, humility and love.

And what a challenge for us as Christians!

As this season unfolds for another year, may we not only give physical gifts to others, but also gifts of our own gentleness, humility and love, as we follow the example of the baby in the manger.

May you be richly blessed as you celebrate the birth of Christ.

Christmas Post-box

After many years of running this activity, Jane and Geoff Fulford have now hung up their postbags. A huge thank you to them both for all the time and effort they have put into sorting

and delivering the cards over the years.

The Leadership Team will be continuing the Christmas Post-box, which we run to raise funds for Nkanfoa School in Ghana. If you would like to send Christmas cards to anyone in the church family through this scheme, please drop them in the post-box in the church sanctuary by Saturday 17th December and leave a donation in the plate provided. Cards will then be sorted and distributed from Sunday 18th December. Please could we ask that cards are for regular attenders and those who live locally.

For those who prefer to send a card to the whole church family, there will be a table in the church to display these.

Toy & Gift Donations

Sunday 4th December will be our annual Toy & Gift service, where we collect donations of toys and gifts which are distributed to local children and families for Christmas. This year we will be collecting for Leigh North Street

school. We are currently working with the school to establish rough numbers and ages of children who would benefit from a gift, and will provide an age guide for donations in future weekly notice sheets. Anything we receive over and above the gifts needed by the school will be donated to Southend Storehouse, who support families in Southend. A polite reminder —we do ask that all toys and gifts donated are new and left unwrapped. Your donations are very much appreciated. Thank you.

Nativity-Foodbank Donations

Sunday 11th December will be our Nativity service. This year, we will also be using this as an opportunity to collect donations of tinned and long life food for Southend Foodbank. Southend Foodbank is run by The Trussell Trust, whose UK foodbanks gave out 1.3 million emergency food parcels between April and September this year. Almost half a million of these were for children. The need is already great, but The Trussell Trust are expecting this winter to be the hardest yet for foodbanks and the people they support. For this reason the Leadership Team felt it was important to add a foodbank collection to the Nativity service, and all donations will be very gratefully received. Items currently most needed by Southend Foodbank include jam, UHT milk, tinned fruit, tinned chilli/curry/meatballs, tinned carrots, hotdogs and sweet treats such as chocolate bars. Strong re-usable carrier bags are also always appreciated. Thank you.



Advent, from the Latin adventus, meaning arrival or coming, is a chance for us to slow down and take time to prepare for Jesus' birth at Christmas.

It is an opportunity for us to reflect quietly on what Jesus' coming to earth really means for us, in contrast with the headlong rush towards Christmas Day, parties, presents and turkey we experience in the world outside the church.

Traditionally, the colour purple, symbolising penitence and preparation, is used by churches at advent.

At the back of the church, from the beginning of December, there will be a basket of purple ribbons and prayer cards. We would like to encourage you to take one and wear the ribbon round your wrist over the next four weeks, stick it to your computer or pin it to a notice board or somewhere else where you will see it every day.

Use it as a reminder to slow down to prepare for Christmas with expectant waiting, rather than speeding up to get through the list of things you need to do.
