

I remember a few years back in one of my previous churches, having an Easter egg hunt in the service for the children.

Before the service, and before people arrived, some of the Sunday school teachers hid foil wrapped chocolate eggs around the church. When it came to the part of the service where the children took part in the hunt, there was much fun and laughter as the one by one the eggs were found. The service then continued.

Some 3 years or so later, the church was having a Spring clean and we used scaffold to reach the high parts of the church to dust etc. Upon looking down at the church, I noticed quite high up, something shiny on top of one of the pillars, and you've guessed it, it was an Easter egg never found from the Easter egg hunt all those years before. ### **UPDATE ON GDPR**

Thank you to all who have completed the Wesley Data Consent form to comply with GDPR requirements. The Managing Trustees of Wesley have a responsibility according to the guidelines laid down:

"The UK GDPR is the UK **General Data Protection Regulation**. It is a UK law which came into effect on 01 January 2021. It sets out the key principles, rights and obligations for most processing of personal data in the UK, except for law enforcement and intelligence agencies. It's about your data protection.

### GDPR's primary aim is to enhance individuals' control and rights over their personal data.

Completing the Data Consent Form meets our commitment to protect your data that we hold for you as a church attendee and to give you confidence and reassurance that we can promptly inform you of how your information is being used by Wesley Methodist Church should you request this information. "

Data includes but is not limited to: address, telephone number, email address etc.

As part of these obligations it is a requirement that we have completed Data Consent forms in order to use and store your personal information. If we do not have your consent then we are no longer able to use and store your information. These forms have to be completed every two years to make sure that the information is accurate and is still being used for the intended purpose. This action has been put in place to safeguard you as an individual and the Trustees of Wesley Methodist Church. If a breach of privacy occurs we are required to contact TMPC as the Data Controller for the Methodist Church and complete a Data Breach report.

If you do not complete a Data Consent Form then Church Council, as the Trustees of Wesley Methodist Church, are made aware and your information is deleted from the church's database, which means that we would no longer be able to contact you on behalf of Wesley Methodist Church.

If you have not completed a Data Consent form would you kindly consider doing so, forms can be obtained from the vestry or contact either myself or Anna Wratislaw. If you have any questions please feel free to contact either of us.

For those who are interested, the Open Top Bus Service 68 will restart on Saturday April 1st. The service operates on weekends and bank holidays until 17th September. A daily service will operate during school holidays from: 1st to 16th April, 27th May to 4th June and from 22nd July to 3rd September.

Buses will initially run hourly; leaving Leigh (Old Post Office) from 09.30 until 17.30 and returning from Southend Pier from 10.00 until 18.00. A more frequent half hourly service will run during the school summer holidays. Fuller details and times will be displayed at bus stops on the route.
