## **MINISTER'S LETTER**



The season of Lent is upon us once more, a season which coincides with springtime and the rebirth of nature and new life which we see all around us. In my own garden daffodils have emerged from the soil. The church also desires that each of us grow spiritually and experience a reawakening of our relationship with God during the forty days of Lent, which culminate at Easter.

The purpose of Lent is not to make us feel disheartened or uncomfortable in the way we live out our faith, but it is a call to self-examination and for taking a fresh look at our attitude and behaviour towards others. Unconsciously, if we are not careful, we can little by little become self-centred and lapse into an *'indifference to others,'* as I once heard someone call it. Our Christian belief, doesn't allow us to pass by on the other side and so ignore the needs and sufferings of those around us.

The nature of Lent is not intended to punish us, but to remind us of our need for God's grace and of our obligation to put others before ourselves.

The problems and tragedies of the world can at times though, appear to overwhelm us, and leave us with a sense of helplessness, but we must never underestimate the power of prayer to affect situations. To know the gift of prayer and its unfailing power is one of the greatest gifts of Lent.

As we embark on our Lenten journey this year, may we be cheerful and of good heart. Let us thank God for this time of grace and for the opportunity to grow spiritually ourselves, while being conscious of others who may need our help. God wants only what is best for us, and he has given us his only Son as proof of that. Let us keep our gaze firmly fixed on Jesus this Lent, both as a Church and as individuals, as we pray for ourselves, others, and our world.

## An open invitation to Memory Worship

You may well think to yourself – "This is not for me I don't have dementia"

When Rev Julia and I set up Memory Worship in 2017, we named this service "for people with and without dementia".

Memory Worship is 30 minutes in length with all the elements of a regular church service - hymns, prayers, sermon, the peace and a blessing followed by activities, crafts and lovely cake and company.

The service has a clear structure, it always includes familiar hymns and the sermon has one clear simple message (with the exception of some of Pastor Steve's Jokes!) If you still feel "this is not for me" please consider coming along to support someone else? Often a listening ear is the best thing you can offer someone supporting a loved one living with dementia. You could be that support at a time when that person really needed it.

No two people experience dementia in exactly the same way. What may be a help for one person may not be for another. At Memory Worship we try to provide an accepting accessible space where everyone feels held by God. ### The Former Manse Garden Land

Many of you will remember that when the Circuit sold the Manse, a piece of ground was given to Wesley. This land contains a large prunus tree. Originally the idea was to use it as an extra parking space or an area to assist cars passing when entering or leaving the car park. When the land passed to Wesley an agreement was made with our neighbours, to retain the tree to maintain their privacy.

In practice, converting the ground into a useful part of the car park proved complicated and very costly. The former Manse fence prevents a good sight line for cars using it and the level of the ground is lower than the existing driveway by the glass doors. In addition the tree restricts access. The costs quoted for levelling the area and tarmacking it were very expensive.

So we looked at other ideas. Church Council recently decided to work towards a Bronze Eco Church award. This involves a wide range of aspects of the church's building and life. It looks, for example, at our energy use, water use, products that we use, and our recycling. Our land use also comes under scrutiny and we are encouraged to try to manage the land we have to encourage native birds, plants and animals. Obviously we have very little land! This small area is going to be used for this purpose. A mini pond and a damp area have been made, with a log pile for insects. All the planting and seeding will consist of UK native species. An information board will be placed in the garden to explain what is there. We will be providing bird feeders, and areas to encourage insects and amphibians. The area will be fenced.

Please get involved, donations of bird food would be welcomed. Please see Gaye if you have any native wildflowers in your garden that you would like to donate. But she won't come and dig up all your dandelions for you!!

A progress report will be given as the project continues.
