ALS School for the Disabled in Uganda.

Letter from Carmen

Dear Pam

Thank you for your email and your enthusiasm for supporting the ALS.

As you know we are relocating the office, so rather than delay any longer I have copied below the article from the July magazine from which you can use as much or as little as you see fit. I have also copied the facebook post about the attack on the livestock which may be of interest.

I hope the information below is sufficient.

It was nearly 4 years ago when we first visited this school, home to 13 children with varying needs. It was a sad affair, very little support and a lot of hard work.

We thank God for the generosity of those CHI supporters who now sponsor the children, or make a regular contribution to the School.

When we visited this year we found Edward and Louise quite burnt out, volunteer burnout is a very real thing, and after all these years of struggle it really came as no surprise.

After much prayer and long and difficult discussions with Patrick it was felt that the best way forward would be to provide some help. Patrick identified a lovely lady, Maria, to help with the cooking, cleaning and care of the youngsters, on a daily basis, for the princely sum of £70 a month!

These children, with their various medical conditions, are particularly vulnerable to infections and disease so regular medical check-ups are important. Some suffer from epilepsy and their medication is vital but is often missed for lack of funds. These youngsters have a tough life, some drag themselves over mud floors as they cannot walk, use long drop toilets when they can barely stand, and feed themselves when they have no control over the jerkiness of their limbs. With help some of these obstacles can be overcome.

Food has become very expensive in Uganda, as it has in the UK, providing the food needed to keep the children healthy, whilst keeping to a manageable budget is a huge challenge. Fortunately Edward and the more able children can grow some crops in the school garden.

Mattresses and bed linen had definitely reached the end of their life! We mentioned this on our blog while in Uganda and on our return it was a blessing to receive a donation for complete sets of new mattresses and bedding for each child, and you can see from their faces that this was very much welcomed.

Your support will enable continued assistance to these children, giving them comfort, food and the necessary medication. ALS is a safe place, where they learn of God's love for each of them, where they feel cared for and where they can trust those around them.

Your regular donation, however small, would enable the support for ALS to continue, and keep these gorgeous faces smiling!

19th November

Disastrous news has just come in from ALS School for the Disabled in Uganda.

Last night a group of wild dogs gained access to the school grounds and killed 8 goats, 6 sheep and ate 13 piglets. Praise God that this attack happened at night when

all the children were inside in bed or this could have been even worse news. Two people in the area were also attacked by the dogs, one being pronounced dead at the hospital.

We received some very disturbing photos which we will not put on here, but needless to say this has caused much upset among the children who love and care for these animals, and most likely were woken by this horrendous attack.

The livestock are bred to raise much needed funds for the school and so this is a huge setback.

Please join us in praying for the children and adults who have been seriously upset by this event that they might find strength and support from the Lord.

Warm Space Winter 2024/5

This coming winter we are again running the Warm Space at Wesley as energy bills continue to rise and the cost of living still impacts on household budgets. We will again be looking for volunteers to help out.
