Methodist Conference is the main decision making body of the Methodist Church.

From 2026, new stationing guidelines require one minister per 150 members, though re-invitations are not affected. Probationers must have at least 100 members.

This year it will be considering further proposals on Stationing for the future:

- Circuits should review ministerial needs annually at Circuit Leadership Team meetings.
- Discernment conversations will take place in the third year of a minister's appointment.
- Feedback on re-invitations will now be attributed to individuals rather than anonymous.
- Circuit profiles should make greater use of digital tools like websites and videos.
- A shift from 5-year to 7-year appointments is under consideration.
- Probationer ministers should not be planned every Sunday, allowing them time to worship as themselves.

These proposals could have big implications for the Circuit and Wesley in the future. Come and discuss your thoughts at our **General Church Meeting** on Sunday 8th June after the morning service – all are welcome.

Wesley Gardens Update



Most of you will have seen the new pond in the wildlife garden near the car park, which was created in early April with the help of two of Joss's schoolfriends. Tadpoles, newts and pond plants were donated by, among others, a member of Leigh Writers, who meet at Wesley.

The area is establishing fast, and with the log pile, the bug hotels, bird feeders and bird bath, we have a thriving area. I have added cottage garden plants to the wildflower plantings which will give the shady garden a more permanent structure and a longer nectar producing season. We have a vine, a Tay Berry and tomato plants which help towards our goal of producing some edibles for our community on our very limited space. Paths and stepping stones have been sunk into the ground made from donated bricks and paving stones. The pond edge is a work in

progress but will be stabilized soon with cement when we have enough stones. We have a small water collection tub but hope soon to gain a waterbutt to help with water conservation.

In the front of the church, I have planted a dwarf Coxes Orange Pippin Apple tree which I hope will survive the summer months. I have added more native pollinators to the front garden and sewn more wild flower seeds as per the Eco Church plan. There are poppies, scabious, pinks and lavender. The wild mustard was covered in hoverflies in May. The early flowering sage, which has been established for a few years now, is attracting bees, flower beetles, shield bug's and butterflies. In the wall I have put drought resistant pelargoniums and Marigold varieties.

A big thank you to all who have donated plants, bug hotels, bird food, seeds, Tadpoles, newts, and pond water. Special thanks to Peter Moore who has given the vine, and wood preservative for the fence, the Listers for the enormous log and bark, to Steve Hockett who mows the grass and to Alan Severne for the fence, gate and continued support.

Please water the front gardens anytime! Please use the leftover water at the cafe and after coffee on a Sunday on the gardens. Thanks!

I hope our tiny gardens will give some pleasure to our community.
